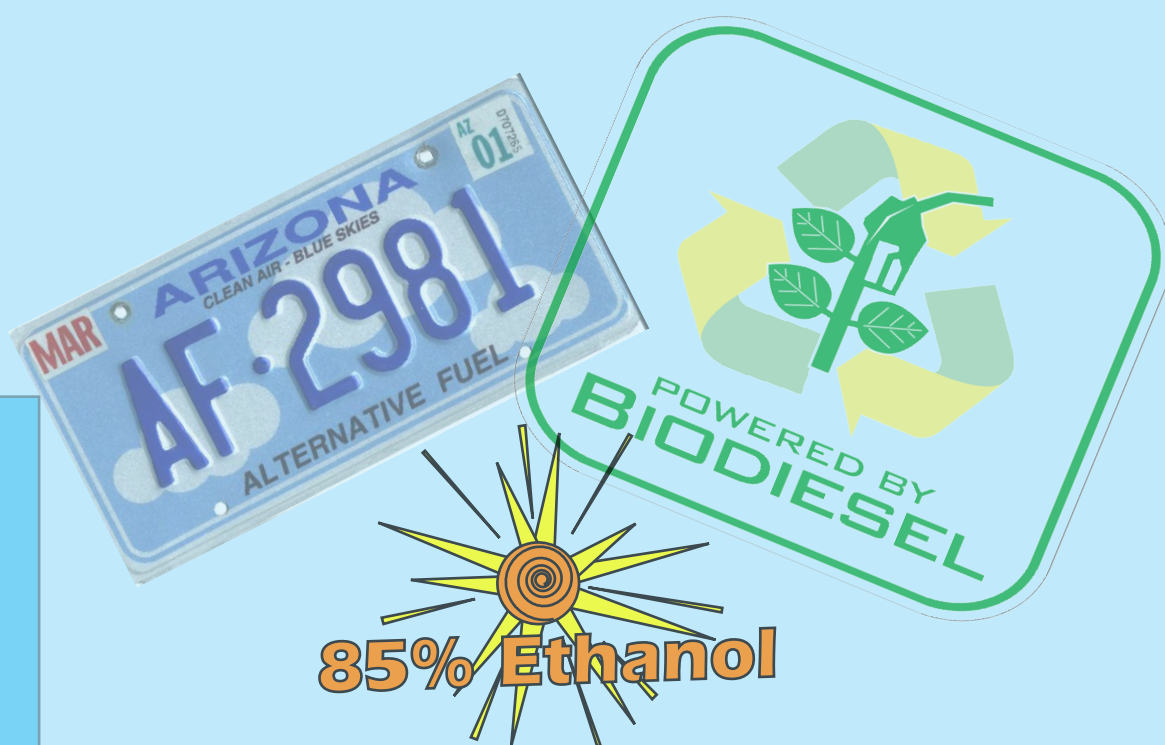
Science Cafes are informal discussions that bring together members of the community and university scientists, to discuss how science and technology can change the future.
