
• Citizens in developing countries are a little more concerned than citizens in developed countries.

• Two-thirds (66%) of citizens worldwide think that measures to fight climate change are mostly an opportunity to improve quality of life




• 27% consider these measures to be a threat to their quality of life

 79% of the citizens think that their country should take measure to reduce its greenhouse gas emissions – even if many other countries do not take measures




